32(h) Privacy	Removes discussion about technology evaluation (Replaced by evaluation tool at Appendix X).
32(r) Locking Bedroom Doors	Adds inspection procedures to reinforce that locks are a right.
32(u) Health Care Decisions	Clarifies that individuals have the right to choose their own healthcare practitioners and pharmacies.

151(c) Staff Physical Examination	Provides updated clarification about acceptable types of tuberculous testing.
162(c) Medication Administration	 Adds language about medication administration training course. Clarifies need for medication administration training before completing training on non-oral medications.
163(d) Locked medications	Requires controlled substances to be "double locked."
165(a) Prescription medications	Requires that over-the-counter (OTC) medications, vitamins, and complementary and alternative medications (CAM) be prescribed by an authorized prescriber to prevent injury or death.
165(f),(g) Psychiatric Medications	Clarifies that psychiatric reviews may be completed by any licensed practitioner acting within their scope of practice.
166(1)-(16) Medication Record	Adds need to document PRN medications on MAR
171, 176 Protection of Food / Returned Food	Amends inspection procedures.
194(a)-(d) Human Rights Team	Aligns guidance with and includes link to Human Rights Team / Human Rights Committee bulletin.
196(a)-(c) Restrictive Procedures - Staff Training	Provides additional guidance about training content and sources relating to restrictive procedure use.
207(4) – Part 2	Clarifies when medications for psychiatric treatment are not chemical restraints.
207(5) – Part 1 Mechanical Restraints	 Includes "mechanical restraint decision tree." Includes bedrail clarification.

207(5) – Part 2 Permitted Procedures	 Clarifies requirement that permitted procedures are not reportable incidents. Includes operational definition of "medical condition."
208(c) Physical Restraints	Clarifies prohibited physical restraints.
251(a) Record Retention	Clarifies record retention expectations.
