Dialing 988 will connect callers directly to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. This session will provide an overview of 988 and its implementation in Pennsylvania.</p> <p>Behavioral Health Managed Care Organization (BH-MCO) Panel: Under the behavioral health component of the HealthChoices program, counties are required to ensure high-quality and timely access to appropriate mental health and drug and alcohol services, and to facilitate effective coordination with other needed services. Each HealthChoices consumer is assigned a Behavioral Health Managed Care Organization (BH-MCO) based on their county of residence. An individual with a dual diagnosis (mental health diagnosis with intellectual/developmental disability, and autism) often presents challenges to the service delivery.
