#### **Polk Closure Complete**

- Polk State Center campus closed 4/14/2023
- To enable the desired final community transitions for 27 remaining residents, one residential building remained open.
- Verland provided ICF services in the remaining building under contract with the state until 3/31/25 when the last remaining residents moved to community settings.

#### **Current Status: Residential**



- Option 1 Data Submission (August 2024)
  - 36 of 400 providers submitted; CY2023 data; none made Select or Clinically Enhanced tiers
  - ODP adjusted a couple of measures downward
- Option 2 Data Submission (Feb 15-March 15, 2025)
  - Re-ran provider data from 1<sup>st</sup> submission period using CY2024 data; 5 providers from option 1 period advanced tiers (notified in 2/25)
  - 366 Feb-Mar submissions for tier determination
    - Primary: 307
    - Select: 33
    - Clinically Enhanced: 26
    - 39 failed to submit, received DCAPs, subsequently submitted
  - On schedule with scoring for notifications by May 15th



### **Current Status: Residential (cont.)**

- Pay-for-Performance request form open (Feb 15-March 15, 2025)
  - Capacity building investments May 2025 payments
    - DSP credentialling (\$25M available)
    - Technology (\$3.75M available)
    - Employment (\$7.5M available)
  - 232 distinct providers requested
    - Credentialing Requests: 223
    - Technology Requests: 137
    - CIE Requests: 167




## **Starting to See Results...**

- Increased employment
  - Increase in percentage of people employed
    - 1% increases for NG1 and NG2
- Major improvement in health risk screenings
  - 80% reduction in individuals without screening
  - 79% reduction in missed screenings fpr people at high risk
- Improvement in incident reporting fidelity
  - 50% reduction in potentially unreported incidents of abuse/neglect
  - Improvements in all timeliness measures
- Improvements in risk prevention in residential habilitation settings
  - Reduction in number (decrease of 160) and percentage of violations considered high risk .2% reduction CY2023 to 2024
    - 29% reduction in citations for abuse/neglect




#### **AAW Interest List**

- Currently enrolling an additional 25 adults into AAW
- 1,123 on AAW interest list in 9/2024
- Previously no requirement for individuals on interest list to have level of care determinations for eligibility.
- ODP systematically working through interest list to ensure people waiting are eligible for AAW
  - 481 individuals were removed from interest list. Primary reasons: unresponsive to multiple attempts to contact; unable to locate; moved out of state; found ineligible



# Median & Average Years on Waiting List Age 21+ Emergency Category






# Number of Individuals Age 21+ Emergency Category On and Off the Waiting List Compared to Number of Individuals on the Waiting List
