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Introduction


The Office of Developmental Programs (ODP) created this statistical report so that all stakeholders can review the number of individuals ODP serves, where they live, what services are provided to them, and the costs of those services. It should be noted that, in some cases in this report, information about ODP's autism services is listed separately from intellectual and developmental disabilities because the Adult Autism Waiver (AAW) and Adult Community Autism Program (ACAP) are administered directly by the Bureau of Supports for Autism and Special Populations (BSASP), and not by the county systems. BSASP's information is tracked and measured through different processes.

Facts and figures are an important but limited view of the service system. They allow us to assess growth in the programs provided, types of services that are prioritized, and how we are investing in people. In addition to this statistical report, ODP publishes an annual report on strategies and performance measures developed by ODP's Information Sharing and Advisory Committee (ISAC) that it uses, along with other data sources, to assess the system.

In the interest of transparency, graphs note the source of information and some data represents counts on June 30, the final date of Pennsylvania's state fiscal year (FY or SFY), while others represent. A guide to commonly used abbreviations can be found at the end of this report.




Enrollment in ID/A Programs


Number of Individuals Enrolled per ID/A Program on the Last Day of the State Fiscal Year


Enrollment in Autism Programs


Number of Adults Enrolled on the Last Day of the State Fiscal Year




Private Intermediate Care Facilities/ID Individuals and Paid Claims


