



Restrictive Procedures

GUIDING QUESTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS

As a team, are you considering strategies that:

- limit an individual's movement, activity, or function?
- interfere with an individual's ability to acquire positive reinforcement?
- result in the loss of objects or activities that the individual values?
- require an individual to engage in a behavior that the individual would not engage in given freedom of choice?

Restrictive procedures may be warranted. If so, update the FBA and or re-assess current strategies and interventions. Develop a plan and submit it to your agency's Human Rights team. Restrictive interventions MUST be approved by a HRT before being implemented.

Restrictive Procedures are not warranted. However, staff should continue to monitor and evaluate risk by updating the FBA and or re-assessing current strategies and interventions.
